On Saturday, July 18th, a Pistol Permit Class for will be conducted at the club. This course may be used in Oneida and Madison Counties to begin the application process. Instructors for this course are: Mike Smith, Jon Pawlika, and Jim Pawlika, all NRA Certified Handgun Safety Instructors.

Interest in obtaining pistol permits has skyrocketed recently in New York State. Most training classes fill as soon as they are opened. Right now there are 15 people signed up to take this class at our club.

Altogether over the last 5 years, over 250 people have taken this Basic Handgun Safety Course at the club.

UTAH NON-RESIDENT CONCEALED CARRY PISTOL PERMIT COURSE

This four hour course is required by law for those over 21 who meet the eligibility requirements for the Utah Non-Resident Pistol Permit. This course is for those living outside the State of Utah, who would like the benefit of traveling outside NY State with a concealed firearm in up to 30 states. While a NY State permit is **NOT** required to take this course, the Utah permit is NOT VALID within NY State, and therefore cannot be used to purchase, possess, transport, handle, carry or use a firearm in NY State. Many NY State permit holders have a Utah multi-state permit. When traveling out of state, check the current version of laws applying to concealed carry. An unfortunate “brush with the law” outside NY State can affect your status as a NY State permit holder. Act prudently and plan your trip out of state with directions for travel — and directions for legal concealed carry! Well over 200 permits have been issued to New Yorkers through our courses. Permits generally arrive at your door 60 to 70 business days after your paperwork is received in Utah. The class focuses on seven key areas, taught in two sections:

Section I - handgun safety, operation, shooting fundamentals, safe handling

Section II - Select sections of Utah Criminal & Traffic Code & US Federal

Firearms Regulations (Title 18, Chapter 44)

BRING TO CLASS:

1. Your driver's license AND NYS pistol permit if you have one
2. Your completed Utah Permit Application here-
Application for the Utah Concealed Carry Permit

3. A black ink pen and paper to write on
4. CASH ONLY if registering at the course - exact change appreciated
4. Proof of payment - Receipt
5. DO NOT BRING FIREARMS OR AMMUNITION TO CLASS

Pistol Shooting Tip # 6 - Flinching

Flinching is the convulsive movement made just as the hammer falls that causes shots to miss the target, or strike anywhere from the 5 ring to the 8 ring. All shooters suffer from this malady at one time or another. When a competitive shooter gets an eight he has flinched because he would never put pressure on his trigger with his sights aligned in the eight ring, (windy shooting excepted). Your progress in the competitive field of target shooting depends largely on your ability to overcome flinching. I include all such movements as “Bucking,” “Jerking” in the general term “Flinching.” Here is exactly what happens: If you know the exact moment your pistol is going to fire, your subconscious mind orders you to brace your body against the recoil, and you do so, resulting in a flinch. The remedy is to never know the exact instant the hammer will fall. Even then your subconscious mind will make brace, but the reaction time between the explosion and your bracing will allow the bullet to leave the barrel without being misdirected by your flinch.
