ACCMC - Women & Youth Day Hunt

The Affiliated Conservation Clubs of Madison County received a Friends of the NRA Grant to sponsor a special hunt this fall. Details are being finalized and information about the hunt is being provided here.

DATE - Sunday October 14th

TIME - 9 am to approx. 4 pm

LOCATION - Vernon National Shooting Preserve

The event is open to the first 30 individuals who sign up. First chances are for women, then young ladies (14-21 yrs.), then boys (14-16 yrs.) All shooters MUST have completed the Hunter Safety Course and passed.

Each shooter needs to provide their own shotgun and bring at least 4 boxes of shells. 2 boxes of #7 1/2 or #8 shot and 2 boxes #6's.

Coffee/tea, and bake goods and lunch will be provided for participants. Parents, guardians and others will be expected to pay \$10 for their food.

Rain Date will be scheduled for early November.

Participants need to work with a local club (member of the ACCMC) to have their names forwarded. (Name, Address, Phone Number - need to be forwarded from club to event chairmen.)

Each participant will begin with instruction in gun handling, then Trap Shooting, then Five Stand Shooting (to learn different angles for shooting safely.) At the same time, expert dog handlers with their dogs will be taking people into the field to explain pheasant hunting and how a dog works. There will be field hunting and an afternoon tower shoot. Everyone will get a chance to shoot pheasants and everyone will take a pheasant home.
